- Prepare and gather graduate school materials early – many programs want applications by end of Junior year

JUNIOR YEAR TIMELINE

- August:** Use course syllabi to plan Fall semester | Begin working on resume and narrowing career interests
- September:** Get advised for Spring classes | Attend Fall career fairs and apply for Spring internships
- October:** Register for Spring classes | Submit FAFSA for Senior year | Begin gathering materials for grad school
- January:** Use course syllabi to plan Spring semester | Apply for scholarships | Research Summer internships, research, and shadowing opportunities
- February:** Get advised for Fall classes
- March:** Register for Fall classes | Ask for letters of recommendation for grad school or job applications
- May:** Plan for Senior capstone, internship, or research project
