

# Angela Walters

Angela earned her Bachelor of Arts in History with a minor in Women and Gender Studies from Midwestern State University (2022) in Wichita Falls, Texas. She earned her Master of Arts in History from Midwestern State University (2024) in Wichita Falls, Texas. Angela is currently a PhD student in European History and a Teaching Assistant at the University of North Texas in Denton, Texas. Her teaching background includes being a Teaching Assistant from 2019 to 2022, being an instructor of record at Midwestern State University from 2023 to 2024.

Angela's focus for her doctoral research is Gender in the Holocaust, with a specialization on Ravensbrück, the only women's concentration camp. Some of Angela's papers about Ravensbrück have covered slave labor, female perpetrators, the war crime trials, and the youth camp Uckermark. Her Master's Thesis is titled "Gender in the Holocaust: A Comprehensive Study of the Ravensbrück Concentration Camp 1939-1945." Her doctoral advisor is Dr. Vojin Majstorovic. Dr. Kerry Goldmann, Dr. Kathryne Beebe, and Dr. Wesley Phelps also serve on her committee, and she plans to graduate with her PhD in 2029.

Angela has lived in Texas her entire life. Her fascination in history started in high school. She wrote her first paper about German women supporting and participating in Nazi Germany in 2020. She started researching Ravensbrück directly after that. Angela's other research includes papers about the *Nachthexen* (Night Witches), who were Russian women pilots that bombed Nazi supply lines and provided food and ammunition to Soviet forces. Angela visited Ravensbrück in June 2023. She plans on visiting Ravensbrück again while working on her dissertation.
